EMMA ANDERSON COOKBOOK

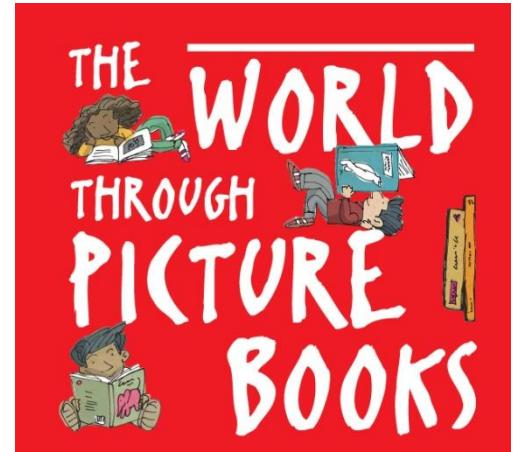
